2018 WP CONVENTION

2019 WP - PCR CONVENTION

The 2019 Convention will be held May 2-5, in conjunction with the NMRA Pacific Coast Region convention, which is May 1-5. The convention will be held in Sacramento at McClellan Park.

As it is the 70th anniversary of the California Zephyr, I have been talking with Cathy and Ernie von Ibsch as well as several directors and members about making the theme of the convention the CZ and turning it into a celebration of the train and its people. We are looking at special Zephyr focused special events. One item I hope to have done for the convention is a reprint of Headlight 17 and 18 as a combined book.
