FUNDRAISING

The first donation thank you letters are being stuffed and prepped for mailing. I am donating the paper and printing (as well as my labor) and will try to donate the mailing cost.

I have two grant applications (one for WP 165 and one for roof work on the "Charles O. Sweetwood") that will be sent in the next 2 weeks.

Work continues with Big Fish on a mailing to the Blairsden / Graeagle area to promote visitor and memberships. We are working on how to do this for minimal cost.

Had a meeting on Wednesday with a housemover who has done extensive work with History San Jose, along with the donors and a rep from CTRC. Plans in place for how to lift the car onto a trailer. I have previously received quote for trucking.

Housemover is working on quote for lift and will also be outlining tasks that can be done with volunteers to lower cost. Donor of the car is still planning to donate funds and also has secured additional donors to the movement and restoration. Also, they would like to work with us on a Go Fund Me campaign for the car. Quote for move is expected Friday or Monday and then I plan to start working up Go Fund Me with the car donor. Arrangements for placement at CTRC restoration site in place.

RAL BOOKING PROMOTIONS and IMPROVEMENTS

As discussed in the Marketing Report, Big Fish is working on ways to improve RAL booking and promotion. We also want to start the joint marketing with the Pullman House and perhaps other lodging venues.

In looking at ways to make this workable, I found an on-line booking software that integrates with Vend and provides an instant booking calendar that the store staff, customers and RAL engineers can view on-line. It will take bookings, payment and even create a waiting list in case someone cancels. It looks like it can be set up to provide wait times between bookings, set up for specific time blocks and can have blackout times / days. Cost for unlimited bookings is \$30/month. Cost for 50 bookings per month is \$20/month. Previous to the meeting, I sent information on this with KC Dunn, Ethan, Patty and Kerry for feedback.

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2019 CONVENTION
