## WESTERN PACIFIC CELEBRATION

Event held August 2-4 (Friday-Sunday)

Greg Elems and I have been working on plans for the August event and hope to start advertising soon. We are calling it the "Western Pacific Celebration" to avoid stepping on the Railroad Days brand. Goal is to maintain an event in August to keep people coming but not supercede Railroad Days when / if that restarts.
