# **Opening**

  - Noted income coming up by we have some expenses going higher, chiefly insurance

# Election

- Noted that there were more write-ins, found on 2 ballots, but that names were not members and this invalidated the ballots under FRRS rules

Noted that election materials were taken to City Clerk for certification.

Floor then opened to questions from membership.

- Question about terms for 3 non-3 years seats (filling open seats)
  - Those elected to fill open seats will need to stand in upcoming election

Steve Habeck thanked the committee for running a tight election and noted that, as per our standard, rules were followed and no issues occurred.

Matthew Shuman thanked Eugene Vicknair for his assistance in getting ballots mailed and printed.

Noted that Don Nelson work a week recently with the backhoe clearing the grounds.

Volunteer work crew previous weekend did a lot of clean-up and repair work.

Steve Habeck expressed thanks to the members for all their hard work and to the members who have been around 10+ years.

Greg Elems was glad to see how many crew were on hand to run trains. Noted that when Loren Ross returns from vacation, they are planning to replace a broken frog on 1-2 switch. He would like to see more volunteers so we can accomplish more things.

Kerry Cochran appreciates the volunteers who have been coming to the museum.

- Hoping to attract more volunteers
- Noted there is lots of work going on "behind the scenes" and not readily apparent to casual observers
- Thanked Paul Finnegan for his work on website
- Shared that there is lots of archives work going on and the he himself just spent 9 days at the museum working mainly on archives and the archives research room
- Thanked Eugene Vicknair for work on the Salt Lake City Convention
  - Looking forward to 2019 Convention
- Asked folks to watch for more news from the Society

Eugene Vicknair discussed the Society's growing community and political contacts and how our support in local government has grown.

- As head of Funding Department, he noted several grants and other funding work that is in progress
- Thanked those who have provided support for updating our various policies and operating systems, in particular Kerry Cochran, Rick Gruninger, Paul Finnegan and others
- Noted that several facilities projects are ongoing, large and small, including trackwork, the Archives Research Room, the Whitman Building purchase and other areas for expansion and improvement
- Funding is one of our biggest needs.

Charlie Spikes told the members that Bob Sims asked Charlie to thank the members for electing him, as Bob could not attend the meeting.

- Thanked everyone who helped with the Model T project
- Thanks those who helped with facilities work, including Bil Jackson
- Believes we are moving the Society forward faster than anyone anticipated

Janet Steeper thanked everyone who supported her and thanks to the FRRS Board.

- Commented that she is a positive person and tries to inject humor and defuse acrimony
- Noted that she sits on the Board of the Dayton Historical Society and another museum Board
- Stated that she wants to help with FRRS archives
- Thanked Paul Finnegan for sharing his audio tour code with the Dayton Museum
- Thanked everyone with the FRRS and commented that she has been treated with kindness and respect
- Hopes to encourage cooperation and civility
- Looks forward to everyone "rowing together" and moving forward

Now we have water, heat, rewired electrical, working shop bays, etc. We added track, connected new tracks and rebuilt much of the yard.

Matt Shuman, Debbie Lentz and Ann Morningstar had to leave. They thanked everyone for the evening. Members formally thank them for their great election work.

Paul Finnegan touched on how much work has been done to share more information on the historic equipment in recent years.

- Talked about info he dug up on the WP weed burner, including oral history from former operator, color photos and a Fairmont catalog.
- Asked folks to send info on equipment so we can share on website and capture the histories.

Discussion about our unique collection and the mission of the FRRS.

Discussion about the visitor experience and reactions of visitors.
