You only need to attend one of the two days. You are **not** required to attend both days. Classroom and Rules test will be conducted on both days and each day is identical.

Should you not be able to attend the training days in April/May, The mandatory rules test can be provided through the year.

Railfan Day 2005

The Portola Railroad Museum has decided to return the Railfan Day event in 2005.

Lodging at the Museum

The Portola Railroad Museum provides sleeping/lodging facilities for its working crew during the year.

Weather you work on facilities, in the mechanical department, the operating department or any other area, the museum has lodging and restroom/shower facilities for its members.

Most of the time the lodging facilities are open to use without much notification, however during the peak-operating season (May thru September) reservations are required.

This requirement has been in place for about four years and prevents members from arriving at the museum and finding no room or wakening another member up in the middle of the night when they arrive late in the evening.

During the peak operation season, reservations can be made by contacting the Superintendent of Operations and/or checking the posted reservation sheet in the operating office for a vacant space in the sleeping car.

Advanced calls to the museum manager are also helpful to members so he can check the reservations sheet prior to your arrival.

As in the past the reservation sheets will be available starting on the crew-training weekend Saturday April 30th and Sunday May 1st.

As always restroom and shower facilities are open to all member at any time during museum operating hours.
