Admission is \$10 per car load, or \$5 per car load with 3 cans of non-perishable food for the EPCAN food bank.

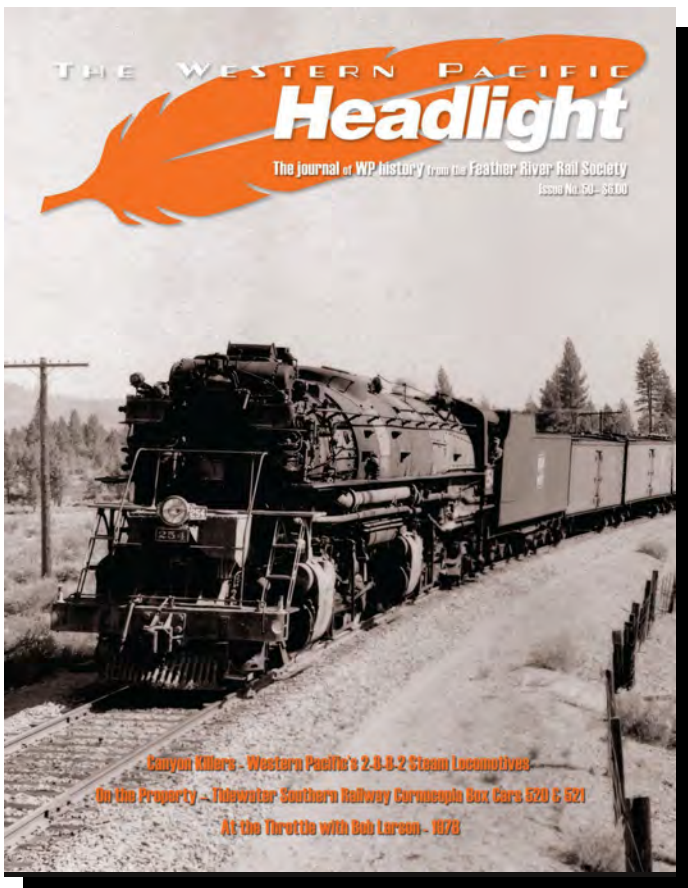
