On Saturday, May 20<sup>th</sup>, as a prelude to the opening of the regular operating season, the museum held its annual Western Pacific Celebration. Due to the various events that had been held the week before, including Media Day, the SP Convention visit and the Motor Car event on May 14<sup>th</sup>, the museum had seen a lot of cleaning and reorganizing, as well as shuffling of equipment in the yard. This made for a great setup to welcome visitors and show off the facility.

While the original plan was for trains to be headed by WP 0-6-0 165, several factors kept the 165 in the shop. Instead, WP SW1500 1503 got the honors and led the caboose trains for the day. Visitors got a chance to tour several pieces of open equipment and get up close with some of our newer acquisitions, such as Western Pacific 1910-built coach first 302 which arrived last October and WP boxcar 61180, donated last year by the hospital in Chester.
