He is writing a column for the magazine on the California Zephyr and was looking for some photos of the Western Pacific. After several exchanges, we were able to set up a photo request and he indicated what photos he would like to use from our collection. Our webmaster, Paul Finnegan, set up a download link and we were able to place a set of photos in a folder for Patrick to download the photos. When the article is published, we will be sent a couple of copies of the magazine so we can see the pending articles.

Both of these projects were approved by the Archive Manager. Credit for the photos and videos will be given to the Feather River Rail Society/ Western Pacific Railroad Museum.
