#### Departure - Norm Holmes 1927 - 2023

Norm Holmes passed away peacefully at home with his family on Sunday, November 12, 2023.



Norm began his year-round employment with the Western Pacific Railroad in 1953. He worked switching and locals in the San Francisco Bay Area. He made 90 round trips on the *California Zephyr*, being promoted to engineer in 1959.

Norm decided to move to Portola with his family in 1970. They bought 15 acres of pine forested land and built a home in 1971. He lived there until it became necessary to move to Carson City, Nevada for health care.

The Western Pacific was absorbed into the Union Pacific System on December 22, 1982. In an attempt to preserve some of the equipment from the WP, Norm Holmes organized the Feather River Rail Society. He arranged for UP to donate a "covered wagon", WP 921D streamline diesel locomotive, for preservation at Portola. The unit was formally presented to the Greater Portola (now Eastern Plumas) Chamber of Commerce at the Feather River Railroad Days in August 1983.

Norm was elected to the Board of Directors and became FRRS President in February 1984.

Shortly thereafter, the FRRS became a nonprofit corporation. A new museum was created, the Portola Railroad Museum. Under Norm's leadership the museum grew from literally an empty building to what it is today, the Western Pacific Railroad Museum at Portola.

#### November 2023 WPRM Track Work

I have spent several weeks doing track work at the museum with the help of David Elems, Greg Elems, Charlie Spikes, Hank Stiles and Dwayne Vander Veen. The Balloon Track and the East Lead have been tamped and surfaced from the Edenwold Crossing to about 100 feet east of the back gate and fence area. Loren Ross helped for a couple of days on the tamping of track east of the sewer crossing. The worst of the elevation and cross level issues in the Balloon Track have been eliminated.

The tamper suffered a bearing failure in the main generator that powers the work heads, so until I get it repaired tamping anymore track will have to wait.

We replaced the headblock ties and switch ties to the heel block in the rip track switch and put new ties in the heel block of the junction switch. I plan to do some more tie work in the junction switch weather permitting.

#### 2024 FRRS Board of Directors Election

Yet again a post COVID operational year for the FRRS has passed and we are moving forward with the 2024 election and the Election Committee is ready to serve again for the 2024 elections

The three upcoming seats, presently being held by Matt Elems, Steve Habeck and Eugene Vicknair, are available for the June 2024 FRRS election. Nominations will open from January 1, 2024 through January 31, 2024. Nominations can be submitted by voting members of FRRS (IN WRITING) to the Nomination and Election Committee or personally delivered to the Election Committee. Email is an accepted form of written communication for the FRRS. Nominations received earlier than January 1, 2024, will not be accepted and will be rejected. Nominations received later than January 31, 2024, will not be accepted and will be rejected.

Any person eighteen (18) years of age or older who has been a FRRS member of a voting membership unit in good standing for a minimum of one (1) year at the date of the election or appointment shall be eligible to election or appointment as a director.

Please be sure to read the Election Policy at the bottom of the Membership web page (membership.WPLives.org) for additional dates and details if you might be interested in running for the FRRS Board in the 2024. If you have any questions about the election process, please feel free to contact the FRRS Elections Committee at election@wplives.org.

#### **Election Policy Changes**

The FRRS recently updated the Election Policy. The changes are indicated below. The full text is available in the middle of the Membership web page (membership.WPLives.org).

- (G) Ballots shall be mailed by the committee on or before the 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday of April to paid members in good standing, as of the 28<sup>th</sup> of February. All ballots will be mailed via First Class Mail to the membership with "Return Service Requested."
- (P) Should a re-count be requested by a candidate, the Nomination and Elections Committee shall consult with the FRRS Board of Directors as to the process to be used. This may be just a general recount and/or if necessary, the FRRS Board of Directors may advise the Nomination and Elections Committee to use a third party for the recount. Persons requesting the recount will be responsible for all costs (if any) involved to the society to perform the recount.

(Z) No cumulative voting for members of the FRRS Board of Directors shall be permitted.

If at the end of the nomination period the number of nominees equals the number of open positions, commonly known as a white ballot, the following shall occur:

- a) The voting members of the corporation shall be notified in writing that a white ballot exists.
- b) The member notification shall contain instruction for petitioning, in writing, the FRRS Board of Directors to conduct a write in campaign.
- c) Petitions shall be accepted during the period set aside for the acceptance of candidate statements.
- d) The Membership Secretary shall be responsible for verifying the petition submitter is qualified to hold the position of director.

(AA) If a white ballot exists at the end of the period for candidate statement submission, then the nominees shall be considered elected and the membership notified of the election results electronically and via the Train Sheet and the FRRS/WPRM website.

## Meeting our Mission Statement Feather River Rail Society

One of those was the Flying Scotsman's visit to the USA. He was interested on the trip of the Flying Scotsman across the Altamont Pass. He had looked at our website and found photos in our collection that he wanted to use.

During our yearlong exchange of emails and discussions on the Flying Scotsman, we exchanged several messages and photos along with some videos that were in our collection. Thanks to Ken Meeker and Virgil Staff's collections, we were able to find several items that were very useful to the project.

In my last communications with Rowan, he indicated the production of the documentary would be released in 2024. Once it is released, we will get a link posted to the FRRS website for our members to view.

One of the other requests we received this year (2023) was from a writer, Patrick Hiatte for the heritage column for the Cowcatcher magazine. He is writing a column for the magazine on the California Zephyr and was looking for some photos of the Western Pacific. After several exchanges, we were able to set up a photo request and he indicated what photos he would like to use from our collection. Our webmaster, Paul Finnegan, set up a download link and we were able to place a set of photos in a folder for Patrick to download the photos. When the article is published, we will be sent a couple of copies of the magazine so we can see the pending articles.

Both of these projects were approved by the Archive Manager. Credit for the photos and videos will be given to the Feather River Rail Society/ Western Pacific Railroad Museum.

I want to thank all the members of the Historical/ Archive Department on the help and to show how we are meeting out mission statement on providing educational support to the general public.

portunity to see the Oroville area. There is a lot of rail-


road history in the area.



#### 2024 WP Convention Car



Center flow covered hoppers built by American Car and Foundry are used for shipping all types of dry commodities. Due to their design they are easy to unload using either discharge gates or pneumatic unloading discharge tubes. Several variations of this car were produced over the years in different lengths and with different hatch covers.

When discussing the car for the 2024 Convention, we decided on the ACF 3-Bay covered hopper. By using custom decals, you could model the car in the WP version or a fantasy version for the Sacramento Northern or the Tidewater Southern.

With some work this model can be modeled after the actual WP car # 11974 in our collection at the museum in Portola.

Custom made decals: Use to create a road name of your choice. (Can be used to create a WP road name or a fantasy SN or TS road name.)



WP 11974 is a center flow hopper and is one of the later ones with the billboard WESTERN PACIFIC on the side. Built in 1975 by American Car Foundry, it is a 4,600 cubic foot capacity, three-compartment car with six individual loading 30" hatches on top. It has a load capacity of 198,000 lbs.

Union Pacific retired the car and sent it to Jim Dobbas Inc. near Sacramento, presumably for scrapping. This car was purchased by members of the "Western Pacific" Yahoo Group and donated to the museum in 2002.





#### Western Pacific Railroad Museum Events Feed the Community

More than just facilitating local awareness or providing another event, the Pumpkin Patch Express and Santa Trains hosted by the Western Pacific Railroad Museum guite literally help feed the community.

It all started with a Santa Train in December 1992 when a group of Feather River Rail Society (FRRS) volunteers decided to decorate trains with festive lights and offer free hot cocoa, coffee and cookies to the community. As the event grew in popularity, so did the awareness about food scarcity in Portola, California, where the railroad museum is located. With this awareness, the FRRS decided to offer an admission discount with the donation of nonperishable food items so the local bank, EPCAN, could stock their shelves. "In true Christmas spirit, we wanted to find a way to give back to our community," said



Eugene Vicknair, Secretary of the Feather River Rail Society. "We knew our community struggled with the ability to provide food for their families, so the FRRS decided to offer an admission discount with the addition of nonperishable food."



In the same spirit of giving, the Pumpkin Patch Express event was created in 2016. Admission was also discounted, cans were collected, and nonperishable food was once again provided to EPCAN.

According to Dink Rife, EPCAN volunteer, it is estimated that 650 to 850 pounds of food are donated yearly from the Pumpkin Patch Express event and 800 to 1,000 pounds of food are donated from Santa Trains. "In the short span of 10 months, we have served 3,944 clients (averaging 394 a month) and 1,635 households (averaging 163 a month.) She stated, "EPCAN welcomes all un-expired donations of food as well as monetary donations."

Even left over pumpkins from the Pumpkin Patch Express event don't go to waste. In recent years, the FRRS decided to support animal welfare, so the extra pumpkins are packed into boxes and moved by forklift onto a truck for the animals at the Sierra Nevada Zoological Park in Reno, Nevada.

"Donating pumpkins to the Sierra Nevada Zoological Park is something we've done for the last couple of years," said Greg Elems, President of the Feather River Rail Society. "It's yet another way our events help feed the community, even if they are on the wild side."

A refuge for exotic animals, the Sierra Nevada Zoological Park provides a permanent, safe, and comfortable environment for all displaced exotic species. In addition to providing care for the animals, the zoo strives to bring top-quality educational and enriching experiences to their visitors.



According to Cheryl Jones, Manager of the Sierra Nevada Zoological Park, "the donated pumpkins not only provide hours of entertainment for the animals but offer an extra nutritional value to their meals."
